





#### **Community Concerns and Priorities.**


Listening to the community and targeting our activity accordingly.





#### **DISTRICT COMMUNITY CONCERNS**


- 44% of people asked have no concerns at all an increase of 11% over the last quarter
- Road safety remains the greatest concern at 37%
- Priorities will be set after this meeting and after consultation with the District Council based on your concerns.





#### **DISTRICT PUBLIC SATISFACTION**

- 84% either satisfied or very satisfied
- 2 % neither dissatisfied or very dissatisfied





#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**



On a local level, Neighbourhood Watch are run within communities, by local volunteer Coordinators. Schemes work in a variety of ways that reflect the needs of the local community including:

- Sharing crime prevention advice and information
- Running awareness campaigns
- Holding social events and awards for local people and businesses
- Leading community projects, such as litter picks, a community café, flood defence response, presentations in schools and work with young people and children and community messaging with the police.
